Reflections From a Rocking Chair

As we approach the last week of 2021, we are given the gift to be able to look back over the year, and to look ahead with hope and expectations into the New Year. It is interesting how when we started 2021, we were into a terrible winter where we saw no end in sight of the pandemic, but there were hints of a coming vaccination for COVID. As our church family began to gather for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday in the parking lot, there was an excitement of new life and possibilities, of community and being able to be together again. Then, we were able to begin with one Sunday service in mid-May, and then two services at the end of November. Yet there was always the option to pivot and change course as needed.

The Session has been mindful and watchful as to how to lead us through this year, and has done a good job with the information that we have had. It has been difficult to know the right thing to do at the right time, and though we have been a bit more cautious, I am thankful that we have not had many people contract COVID (even as breakthroughs), and much of that is because we have taken seriously our concern and love for one another and for our local community.

In this season of Advent, we have considered the different gifts we have received. I have enjoyed reading the Central Advent Devotional with the stories of the gifts received over our lifetimes. he theme throughout the booklet has been the love of the one who gave the gift. Many of the stories connected gifts received with the greatest gift the world has been given: Jesus Christ. In worship, we have considered the gift of awareness of God's presence, the gift of a new understanding as to who God is, the gift of living in a new way that reflects our following of Jesus, and the gift of Good News which is for all people.

One of the things that I hear throughout Scripture is that we are called to imitate our God who is a God of LOVE. Jesus was one who preached God's love everywhere he went, even when he was dealing with difficult situations with religious leaders and Romans. Love is at the center of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ, and the greatest of all gifts IS Love. This love is from a God who dares to break into our world, who came as a baby, who grew into a man who taught about God's love for everyone, and who demonstrated that love through his actions. In turn, we are to be people of love. Not just to say the word, but to let our lives and our actions reflect this very basic belief.

Love that is lived out is like a constant prayer. Love that is lived out is generous with time and resources. Love that is lived out is being available to one who needs to talk or to simply not be alone. Love that is lived out calls us to set aside our own agendas and to be about the work of God in the moment. Love that is lived out often inconveniences us, yet we discover the blessing in living this different way. Love that is lived out is hard to describe, but you know it when you see it.

Central is one of those churches that takes seriously the living out of Love in this world. My prayer for us as a faith community is that we will grow in our love for God and for one another and for the world. I don't know how that might manifest itself, but I think we will all know it when we see it.

As we enter into 2022, may we lead with Love. May we seek to demonstrate the Love of God in our local community. May we work to share the Love of Christ with all whom we meet along the way. For at Christmas, we know the story of when Love came down upon the earth and changed everything for the better.

- Approval to have Rev. Ann Elyse Van Winkle, Abingdon Presbytery leader, preach at Central on Sunday, January 2. Ann Aichinger will lead worship and they will co-preside at the Communion table at both services.
- To host the January 13 (Thursday) meeting of Abingdon Presbytery at Central. Worship will take place in the Sanctuary, and the meeting will be held in Central Hall followed with a catered lunch.

Livestreaming Worship


Yes, we are now live streaming Sunday worship services and other special opportunities!
