Reflections From a Rocking Chair

Each month at the Session meetings, there is a question that each elder attending is asked to answer. t is a way for us to get to know each other better as we are leading the church. At our meeting this month, we reflected on what we hope for, or are looking forward to, in 2022 or something we wanted to work on in our lives in 2022. Answers ranged from reading more to traveling more to fishing more, eating better and getting exercise into daily life, considering new job options, decluttering the house, hoping for a better year in dealing with COVID, working on being less judgmental of others, and helping children to gain some household skills and abilities.

Resolutions are a part of a new year, but statistics show that by January 20, most resolutions have fallen away and we have returned to our old ways. Maybe instead of making resolutions about things to change in our life, we can consider goals or new habits to include in our lives. I want to share a few of mine with you.

Since Frank's death in June, 2019, my reading has declined greatly. Before he died, I was reading a book a week. But since then, I am lucky to read a book in a month. But, I have decided to set aside some time each day to read. This includes reading for fun as well as reading "churchy" books. Currently, I am reading two books: The Patient Ferment of the Early Church: The Improbable Rise of Christianity in the Roman Empire by Alan Kreider, which was suggested by Rev. Dr. Ray Jones at the Mountain Top Leadership event in October, and Flying Angels by Danielle Steele. It is not just about reading books, but also reading articles in the Presbyterian Outlook or the Smithsonian magazine or Southern Living. Reading involves exercising the muscle for memory and concentration.

Another of my goals is to do better with my self-care and improve my health. I am working on walking more as well as eating better foods. I am also trying to improve my sleeping habits to get better rest. Throughout this last two years, it has been easy **not** to keep our routines or to be eating well. I will continue to see my therapist who is helping me navigate this new time in my life, and offering me needed encouragement.

My third goal is to travel. I have several trips planned for this year including going to Ft. Myers, FL to see Chauncey and his family, and have some grandchildren time. Frank's sister is going to join me for part of this trip and we are going to spend a couple of days in Charleston, SC on our way home. In September, I am excited about a trip to Austria, Germany, and Switzerland! I plan to attend a special event of the Passion Play at Oberammergau, Germany. This is an area of Europe that Frank and I always wanted to visit, but never made it there. I am going with Educational Opportunity Tours, and welcome anyone who would like to join me on this trip. (The Passion Play is offered every ten years and was to be offered in 2020. But with the pandemic, they moved it to 2022. This is an 8-hour presentation of the life of Jesus with a break in the middle for a meal. The whole town of Oberammergau is involved in the production and presentation - it is a cast of 1,000s!) I also want to do some local day-trips to see some of the beautiful area that we live in.

These three goals for me involve setting aside time. Sometimes my time gets away from me, and I end up misusing time and not getting done the things that I really need and want to do. Time is one of our most expensive resources and yet by using our time in activities that enrich our lives, we find the time used well.

So, as we are into a new year, what goals or hopes do you have for 2022? What is some new project or skill you want to do? Is there somewhere you want to go or someone you want to be with in this year? As a part of making resolutions, we are all encouraged to write them down and then begin to make them a reality in life. When we make them visible, we can keep them ever before us. My prayer for us at Central is that 2022 will be a year filled with blessings and joy, and that we can continue to grow in our faith as a church community.

Those from our church who participated were Nic Fuller, Kenzie Starling, Alisa Harris and Clark Wilson. They lived in the Neville Cottage which was a nice house, and perfect for our small group.

There were over 500 college students and their adult chaperones at the conference, and everyone took seriously the COVID protocols throughout our time. The theme was **What's Next?** This question was asked in a variety of ways and for a variety of situations. What's next in college for you? What's next for the church? What's next for our nation? What's next for our world? We had two keynote addresses. One was Mary Laura Philpott who is an author, and has continued to ask that question of what's next in her own life. She shared about times when she wrestled with purpose and calling and what it was she was to do in life. Though she had a variety of jobs, she gravitated toward the business of being an author. Rev. Jerry Canon shared about how he had wrestled with his God, given purpose, and

had been a DJ in a club, as well as finding himself heading to Seminary and to serving a church in the Charlotte area.

Instead of small groups, we had Critical Conversations time where we were in a large group and discussed the keynotes and the worship experiences. This was a chance for our group to divide up and chat with each other

in-depth on topics and issues raised. We each were able to attend different workshops as well which offered insights into answering What's Next?

Session Notes...

The Session met by Zoom on Tuesday, January 18, 2022. The following are actions taken by the Session, and reports received by the session:

- Lee Budd was received as a new member by Reaffirmation of Faith. He will be welcomed on Sunday, January 23;
- Jackson Williams will be baptized in worship on Sunday, Jan 30 in Central Hall;
- Josie Russell will be hired as the Central Presbyterian Media Coordinator (a new position), and she will be working on our social media presence including website update, Facebook and Instagram presence, plus working with the Technology Committee with live-streaming worship weekly;
- Received the resignation of Robert Campbelle as the chair of the technology Committee;
- APPLE Academy has increased the children in the program to 62, and continues to follow the Virginia health department guidelines with COVID;
- Evangelism Committee will be starting a new community group called *A Place Where Questions Matter*. The first meeting will be on January 27, 7:00 p.m. by Zoom;
- The 2022 budget was approved;
- The first vote was approved that up to \$120,000 can be taken from the endowment to cover the 2022 budget shortfall (the second vote will be taken at the February meeting);
- The Tynes Loan has been paid off. This provided money for the gutter repair project;
- The Harmon Estate investments did very well in 2021 and each of the four areas of designated distribution (Youth, APPLE Academy, Music, and Fellowship and Dining) will equally divide \$50,224.00;
- The local portion of the Peacemaking Offering will go to Abuse Alternatives;
- Sunday, January 30 will be a Unity Service (as a fifth Sunday Worship) at 10:00 a.m. in Central Hall;
- On Sunday, January 30, Ann Aichinger will be participating in the installation service of Rev. Rebecca Taylor, who is the new pastor at Hillsville Presbyterian Church;
- Ann Aichinger will be away on vacation April 21-May 3, 2022;
- Ann Aichinger will be away September 2-19 on a trip to Austria, Germany and Switzerland, including attending the Passion Play in Oberammergau;
- The property committee is working on the leak in the balcony area of the Sanctuary and other concerns in the Sanctuary;
- Mike Vollmer and Ann Aichinger reported on the January 13, 2022 Abingdon Presbytery meeting;
- Thank you cards were received from members of the staff for Christmas bonuses.

Souper Bowl of Caring Food Collection Challenge

This year we are inviting the whole congregation to work together to meet the goal of 5,000 food items and/or dollars. ach food item counts as \$1 toward the goal. Sheree Taylor will be encouraging everyone to participate.

There will be Food Pantry Barrels in the entry area, and blue buckets for your monetary gifts

at the worship entry door areas. We will keep the donation amount posted for all to see, and on Sunday, February 13 (Souper Bowl Sunday), we will conclude our formal collection. We hope that this food collection challenge will encourage us all to continue to contribute to the Food Pantry as they help so many in our local area who have food insecurity issues.

Though our efforts will be within our church family, the real winner will be **Bristol Emergency Food Pantry**. This is something every one of every age and ability can participate in. Let's make a difference, and continue to be about the work of Christmas (caring for the needy, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger and unwanted child.)

Items needed (no glass jars or containers)

- Meal kits that don't require extra ingredients (ie. hamburger helper)
- Pancake and muffin mix that only require water
- Canned soups
- Canned pasta meals (ravioli, spaghetti,
- Canned meat (tuna, ham, chicken, beef stew, spam)
- Canned vegetables (no green beans are needed)
- Canned pork and beans
- Canned fruit (no fruit cups)
- Dry Rice or Pasta
- Instant mashed potatoes (plain or flavored)
- Spaghetti sauce (no glass jars)
- Cereal (hot and cold)
- Jelly and Peanut butter
- Breakfast bars/granola bars
- Macaroni and cheese (preferably not needing milk or butter)
- Pantry staples (small containers of flour, salt and pepper, sugar, catsup, oil, etc.)

PLEASE DO NOT BRING RAMEN NOODLES OR GREEN BEANS!

Please do not bring anything in glass jars; they tend to break and are hard to handle.
