Reflections From a Rocking Chair

After Easter, I had a chance to get away for 12 days, and Barbara Mann went with me. This was my usual trip to SW Florida to visit Chauncey and Laura, and the grandchildren (4 ranging in ages from 2-10 years old!) When Frank and I left Ft. Myers in 2002, we journeyed to put our feet in the sugary sand and enjoy the peaceful waters of the Gulf. This time on the way, Barbara and I traveled to Atlanta to visit with some friends and to have a short visit with Bobby Davis in his new home. Then, on to Ft. Myers to stay in an old beach cottage where you can still hear the waves, and if the breeze is strong enough, you can feel the house sway a bit!

But this time, with Barbara along, I paid attention to things that I have been taking for granted and just speeding right on past. Barbara had been through Atlanta, but she had never stopped so while in Atlanta, she enjoyed gathering pinecones from Southern Pines. I also showed her around my old stomping grounds of Agnes Scott College and Columbia Seminary, both in Decatur, GA. Barbara has been to the east coast of Florida before but she had not been to the Gulf side where the sugar sand of the beaches and foliage of the tropics were both new and different. As we traveled, she would point to a tree and say, "What kind of palm is that?" Or when there was a billboard for a citrus store, she would ask if we could stop. As we journeyed to Key West (about 36 hours), she experienced the 91 miles of the US1 Bridge that goes from Miami to the end. For her, everything was new and different whereas I had seen it all, and didn't notice many differences. But having Barbara along this time, and helping her to connect to her new experiences, I had to tap into my "information center" to recall things about having lived there in order to do that for her.

Yes, it was a wonderful trip, and we did have some silly and restful times. But what I take away from this vacation was the invitation to see things anew. As we are in the season of Easter (which goes from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, June 5), we are invited to see all of life anew in the light of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. For all around us we see new life springing forth. We can see the new flowers and bushes that are greening up, the new species of birds that are migrating through our area on their way to their northern home for the summer months, a nest of eggs getting ready to hatch with new baby birds who will begin flying lessons soon, and butterflies fluttering about in the yard.

As disciples of Jesus, we are invited to see our world, and our lives, in the light of the hope and reality of the new life that comes with Easter. Easter is not just about an event that happened 2000 years ago, but about being assured that God is doing new things in our lives and in our world. So often we only see the bad, difficult and hard things happening around us and we wonder if there is anything new occurring, and yet, the invitation is to see, once again, how God is at work. He does this by inviting us to be a part of the new things happening.

It is a matter of perspective. We can just go along with life and not expect anything new or different, or we can choose to look for the new. As followers of Christ, we have this perspective about life, where we can look through the lens of Easter to perceive the new, and it is our calling to point out the new and hopeful aspects that are occurring. When you're faced with just another day, invite the Holy Spirit to help you to see the new all around you. Then be on the lookout...you might be surprised at what you discover! Then, give thanks to God for helping you to see it and then share it with someone else. It just might be a message that they need to hear.

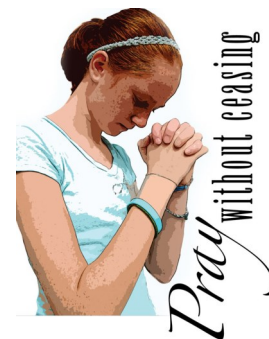
