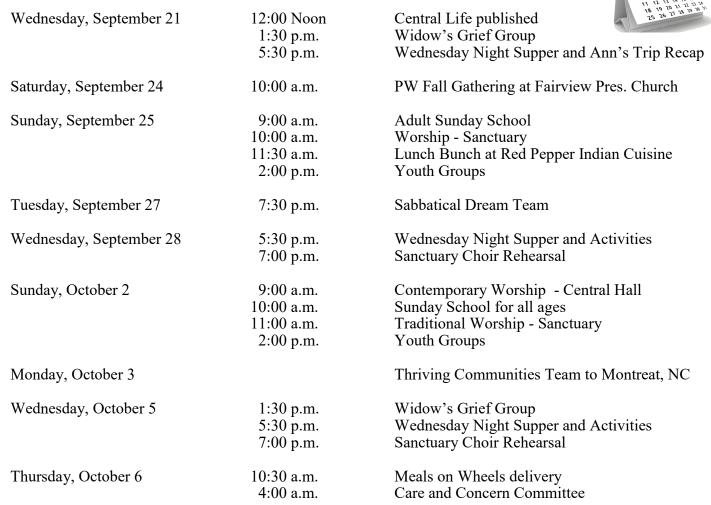

Reflections From a Rocking Chair

So what was the best part of your trip to Europe? That is a hard question to answer, because for me, all those places I went in Austria, Germany, Italy (a day trip), and Switzerland, were new places for me with new sights. I was excited to go to Salzburg where *Sound of Music* was filmed. I was wondering what Zurich and the connections with the Reformer Zwingli would teach me. I was wondering about the Passion Play (6 hours in German of the events of Holy Week), and how that would invite me to new reflections on scripture and who Jesus is. As I went by myself, I wondered about connecting with my tour group, but I ended up leading morning singing on the bus. Seeing the gorgeous mountains of the Swiss and Italian Alps as well as the deep valleys where villages and cities were nestled often took my breath away.

This tour was through Educational Opportunities, and was titled Alpine Wonders. I was with a group of 38, and daily we were invited to consider what caused wonder for us. How and where did we see the glory of God in the sights, sounds, and relationships we encountered? I intentionally did not sign up for all the extra excursions, but instead created some free days for myself. I spent Sunday, September 11, at the hotel in Austria by myself, resting, writing and walking in the area. Another day, I ventured with two new friends across the border to Italy for Pizza and gelato. The amazing thing is that we made it back to Austria, even though we had boarded the wrong train.

Travel is one of those things that broadens perspective on life. To see how others live in this world, and to experience the history that goes back over 1200 years allowed me to be grateful for my own history and education as well as to be grateful for my life here in Bristol. The pillows were flat. I melted my curling iron (forgot about converting the electrical power). Tried some different kinds of foods (I'm still not convinced about brussel sprouts and sauerkraut). But I found a new confidence for myself in being able to navigate big cities like Munich and Zurich as well as the quaint villages of Matrei, Austria and Vipiteno, Italy.

But for me travel makes me appreciate home even more: the comfort of my own bed and pillows; to be with friends and my cats; not having to try to figure out a menu in German, or street signs. Home is that place where you can be yourself. Home is a place of rest and welcome. Home is a place where people are glad you are there.

As we are getting things going for the fall, and starting up activities, my hope is that you will make a plan to come and be a part of life at Central. These last two years have been difficult for all of us, and our "normal" routines have been greatly disrupted. This includes our life together as the community of faith at Central Presbyterian. Some have decided to be a part of the online experience with worship and education opportunities. Others have filled the time that once was considered church time with other activities. Plus the month of September brought two busy weekends for our local community which altered our schedules.

The season of autumn is a new time and a chance to reset our lives again. I want to issue an invitation to come home, and be a part of the church community. There are opportunities to grow in our relationships with one another and in our trust and faith in God. Why not invite someone who you miss seeing as a part of the church to join you? If you have not been a part of the church community in a while, you are welcome to come home. Let us welcome one another and rejoice in our time together. Come and reconnect, and be a part of the community of faith. I look forward to seeing you soon.

Session Notes:

The session met on Tuesday, September 20. We shared about our hopes and dreams for Central in the coming years. The session received reports from committees and took action to approve the following items:

Central Life

- Accepted the resignation of Kevin Lyons as Office Administrator;
- Increase in pay rate for the substitute Secretary. The session thanked Patty Caldwell and Diane Abbey for their service in the office in this transition time. Patty and Diane have agreed to serve in the office for up to 6 weeks until a new staff member is hired (note the change in office hours on page 10);
- The list of Sunday School teachers for the children and adults classes and the curriculum to be used;
- Evangelism Committee is working on some new ways to help connect with the local community;
- Fellowship and Dining reported that a new freezer was purchased to replace the large one in the pantry;
- Stewardship Season will begin on October 16 through Nov. 13, which will be Commitment Sunday;
- The security subcommittee is being re-established and will be getting information out to the congregation;
- The backpack program is seeking to join with Feeding Southwest Virginia in partnership;
- Two worship services will begin again on October 2, and there is a need for a keyboard player for the Praise band;
- John Barker brought a concern about seeking pastoral assistance for Ann Aichinger. A taskforce will be created to consider options;
- Pastoral concerns were expressed for many in our church family.

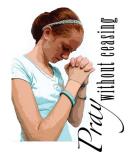
