# **Session Notes**

The session had their annual retreat on Sunday, Jan 22 from 2-4 p.m. with Rev. Ann Elyse Hicks, Abingdon Presbytery Leader, leading us. We worked in teams to put together jigsaw puzzles that had been mixed up prior to our arrival. It was interesting to see the different role each person took in the task at hand. Then we considered core values for our own lives and how those get lived out in our leadership. We also realized that most of the values are a part of our church family and those all help us to respond to the needs and ministries of which we are a part.

After our retreat time, we had our January meeting. Dr. Martin Dotterweich will preach and lead worship on March 19 while Ann Aichinger is out of town.

It was agreed to have the Committee Chairs meeting monthly to coordinate events and projects.

- The Session received the Social Media Director's report for 2022 and had discussion about the outreach effect of our social media efforts.
- The 2023 budget was approved and includes 3% raises for the staff.
- The first vote was taken on approving use of up to \$165,000 from the Endowment to cover expenses as needed. The Second vote will be in February.
- Approved having a unity service on Sunday Feb 12 as a part of the Souper Bowl Challenge with a fellowship soup lunch following worship.
- Update was given about the Ukrainian family's arrival into Bristol, and the efforts in preparing for them to be here.
- The March meeting will be held on March 28 at 7 p.m. hybrid. At this meeting, the confirmation class will attend and be welcomed into the membership of the church.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, February 21, 7 p.m. hybrid.



On Friday, Feb 10, a plane will arrive at Tri-cities airport at 10:10 p.m. with 4 very special people on board. Igor and Anna Mashkin, and their children Nikita and Eva will be passengers having traveled from Bucharest, Romania through Paris and Atlanta to arrive here in the Tri-cities. # PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

#### PCUSA Response to the Earthquake in Turkey and Syria

Amid news of a devastating earthquake in Syria and Turkey, the Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) has reached out to offer assistance to partners in the area, where thousands have died, and is asking Presbyterians to pray for those impacted by the quake and its aftershocks.

Through a coordinated response by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and World Mission, PMA has contacted multiple long-term partners of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) including the National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon; the Middle East Council of Churches; the Forum for Development, Culture and Dialogue; and the Fellowship of Middle East Evangelical Churches. The partnerships have been established over the years through ecclesial work and to help people recover from war and other tragedies, such as the explosion in Beirut a few years ago. They are able to respond quickly to this humanitarian crisis and to be able to help those in the most need.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and World Mission rely on long-term partnerships to quickly provide aid when disaster strikes around the world. PDA also plans to respond through ACT Alliance members on the ground to address urgent needs and provide humanitarian aid. ACT Alliance is a global faith-based coalition that operates in more than 120 countries.

Needs among those affected are believed to include blankets, medication, hygiene supplies, temporary housing, and heating, said Dayna Oliver, Associate for International Program Administration for PDA. Congregations and individuals interested in helping to donate to **PDA DR999999** which is the code for assistance to the earthquake situation. Through everyone's gifts and generosity, the PCUSA is able to partner with those on the ground to attend to the immediate needs that have been identified by our partners, knowing that there will be long-term projects that will develop during the recovery stages.

# How I came to write Earth Touching Heaven: An Appalachian Requiem

When Susan and I considered moving to Southwest Virginia, we were not sure at first that it was the right decision. We had lived in Cincinnati for 20 years and were heavily involved in music-making: neither of us wanted to move away from our musical attachments. But we've both found fulfilling careers here, and there have been plenty of outlets for making music in the Tri-cities.

What surprised us most is how the majesty of the mountains surrounding us has inspired my music. The incredible scenery has been the very lifeblood of Appalachian musical traditions for centuries, and it was impossible for me not to feel its influence. The astonishing beauty I saw on my daily commute from Abingdon to Lebanon was a constant inspiration. I was reminded daily that "God owns the cattle on a thousand hills," which gave me thematic material for "Glory to God in the Highest." The rich melodic tradition of Appalachian music gave me thematic ideas for "Have Mercy, Lord" and "I Believe." I directly quote two traditional Appalachian tunes—"Holy Manna" and "Soar Away"—in "I Believe" and "Lamb of God." And my friendship with Jane Morison prompted me to write a *Sanctus* for the Highlands Youth Ensemble, which she directs, years before I incorporated it into the *Requiem* as "Holy, Lord God Almighty!"

My father died in 1993. When my mother passed away in 2010, I was determined to finish the work as a *Requiem* in memory of my parents. The first and last movements— "Rest from Your Labors" and "In Paradise"—are based on melodic themes from a song I wrote in 1991 for their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. According to my brother, my mother listened to this song every day for the rest of her life. The pandemic lockdown of 2020-21 provided the time for me to complete the work, and the resulting deaths worldwide provided the final impetus for doing so.

So here is *Earth Touching Heaven: An Appalachian Requiem*, in memory of my parents Rose & Gene Campbelle, and for all the people worldwide who lost their lives in the pandemic. The work will be premiered by the Symphony of the Mountains, the Voices of the Mountains, the Highlands Youth Ensemble, and the Milligan Concert Choir. The performance is on Saturday, March 4, at 7:30 PM at the Toy Reid Center in Kingsport. **Tickets can be purchased online at www.symphonyofthemountains.org Go to "Events Calendar to place your order.
