#### **Session Notes:**

The session met on Tuesday, November 21 at 7 p.m. After a devotional led by Rev. Ann Aichinger on discernment and the process of prayer using the Ignatian way (the Examen), the session spent time sharing about the things they are thankful for about Central Presbyterian Church.

Three deaths were acknowledged: Mary Kay English, Marvin Tadlock's wife, Kimberly Tadlock and Eugene Waldron's sister, Joy Waldron. Ann Aichinger gave her pastor's report and reviewed the calendar. Linda Waldron gave the clerk's report which included the minutes of the October Session meeting and communications received.

Each of the Committees reported on their work. Approval was given for the Christian Education events in December which were included in the calendar. Mission Committee thanked everyone for their participation in the Samaritan's Purse Shoebox project in which 36 boxes were packed and delivered. The Finance Committee reported that due to the delay in the Employee Retention Credit monies (total of \$66,013.58), a withdrawal from the New Covenant funds of \$66,000 was taken to help cover cash flow and expenses until the end of the year. The property committee is planning on changing out the lights under the portico area of the church as they are mostly inoperable at this time. We do have a new cleaning service at the church and we thank Gale Thompson for working on this and with this new team. The worship team thanked everyone for participating in writing of this year's Advent Devotional, and a special thanks to Ivy Ritchie for coordinating this project. Elders to serve Communion on December 3 were recruited. Reminder about decorating the church will happen on Sunday, Nov 26 after worship. All are welcome to be a part of this.

The **results of the Worship Survey** were presented. We had **97** responses which is an excellent engagement by the active members of the church. With the data presented, the Session discussed and approved, unanimously, to continue with the combined Unity services at 10 a.m. on Sundays, and alternating between the Sanctuary and Central Hall for now. We will continue to offer the online option as there is a significant group who uses this means to be at worship.

With no new business for the session to consider, Ann Aichinger reviewed the pastoral concerns, and John Barker closed the meeting with prayer. Our next meeting will be Tuesday, December 19 at 7 p.m. (hybrid).
