

December 24 Sunday worship and Christmas Eve Worship

Reminder that we will have the fourth Sunday of Advent Worship at 10 a.m. in the Sanctuary on Dec 24. Joy Briggs will offer 15 minutes of music from 9:45-10 a.m. for those who come early.

For **Christmas Eve worship**, we will have two services: 5 p.m. in Central Hall and 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary with Communion and Candlelight at both. There will be a nursery available at the 5 p.m. service.

The **Christmas Eve offering** this year will go to support the Backpack program which feeds 105 children every week. These children live in homes with food insecurity and it provides nutrition when school is not in session. Offering plates will be at the door of both worship spaces, and everyone is encouraged to support this vital ministry of Central to our local community.

On Sunday, Dec 31, we will have **Be the Church Sunday**. We will gather for worship at 10 a.m. in Central Hall and then everyone will be invited to participate in different activities for a few minutes as we work together in being the church. The projects that will be available are:



- making fleece blankets that will go to the hospital to the dialysis and cancer centers;
- knitting or crocheting hats, scarves or mittens
- making blessing bags for homeless and those in need
- * creating bagel birdseed feeders to hang in your trees
- * writing Christmas notes to US military service people
- * helping with preparations for the backpack program (packing small bags of items).

We will come back together to offer our gifts and projects and then be allowed to leave. Or you are welcome to stay a bit longer and complete the project. This is a great opportunity to invite a neighbor or friend who does not have a church home to come and be involved and see what Central is all about. There will be things for everyone to participate in as well as to take home and continue to work on. Come join us for a wonderful Sunday together to Be the Church!

- Finance Committee brought the motion for the first of two votes to allow access from the Endowment in 2024 up to \$150,000.
- Christmas Eve Offering will go to the Backpack program to assist feeding hungry children in our local community.

Other committees made reports about upcoming events. Ann Aichinger shared the pastoral concerns and wished everyone a happy and merry Christmas. John Dodge closed the meeting with prayer and the meeting was adjourned.
