### Souper Bowl of Caring/Tackle Hunger 2024

Thank you to everyone who participated in making contributions to our Super Bowl of Caring campaign. We collected 992 food items and \$1,951 for a total of 2943. The Bristol Emergency Food Pantry received all of this and it will go to help provide food for our neighbors in need. As a national campaign, over 2.6 Million dollars and food items were collected and distributed to local food agencies this year.
