

It seems like yesterday that we were "falling back" and had an extra hour of sleep. NOT THIS TIME! It certainly seems that Spring is on its way and hopefully will arrive without any more snow or freezing weather. But that is not for us to say. What happens with the weather will happen. I have been asked why Easter is so early this year. And that is because Easter is a lunar holiday. It is a moveable feast and is determined from year to year based on the phase of the moon.

You may say, "What are you talking about?" Well, you can figure out when Easter is by starting at the Spring Equinox (March 20-21) and then go to the full moon. Easter is the next Sunday. So Easter can be as early as March 22 though that is rare (the last time that happened was in 1818 and the next time it will be that early will be in 2285). The latest it can be is April 25. Easter is spring holiday because according to Scripture, Jesus Christ's death and resurrection took place during the Jewish Passover, which typically falls in March or April.

But we need to remember that every Sunday is a celebration of the Resurrection and a day to rejoice that our Lord lives. During the Lent, the Sundays are not included into the observance because we are on this side of Easter and know the reality that Christ does live and so on Sundays we gather to celebrate the reality of Easter all year long.

This year, Holy week begins with Palm Passion Sunday on March 24 and as a part of worship we will read the passion story from Mark's Gospel. We will have a Maundy Thursday service on March 28 at 7 p.m. and share in Communion. Then our Good Friday observance will be at State Street United Methodist Church at 7 p.m. with the presentation of *Earth Touching Heaven: An Appalachians Requiem* written by Robert Campbelle. On Easter Sunday we will gather for worship followed by a reception and Easter Egg hunt.

As we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord, I hope you will make plans now to be a part of Holy Week activities and services.




