Backpack program and adding community gardens in our neighborhood. We also considered ways of moving our church into the neighborhood more and getting to know our neighbors and their needs.

One of the activities we did was to create a timeline of Central and the Tri-cities area. Then to add good/positive events that had happened and those things that created challenges and had negative impact. What was interesting when we looked at the whole, we saw that during Covid (2020-2022 and into the present), we did many new things and tried new ways of gathering and connecting the church to one another. We showed great courage as we brought the Mashkin family to be in Bristol, and as we had the butterfly garden established on the bank. Also we recognized that we were willing to do new things even if we didn't know quite what we were doing.

We will be having more large group meetings as well as sharing this information on Wednesday evenings in April. Though we thought this was our last cohort meeting, we may be going back for our 5th and final meeting in October.
