

Reflections from a Rocking Chair:

This week, I attended a Committee on Preparation for Ministry meeting and preparing to welcome Scott Sikes as a new inquirer who is sensing a call into the ministry. As we were talking about the process and what he needed to be doing in this first year, Rev. Ann Elyse Hicks said, "you will need to take the Bible Content Exam." This led us into a conversation Literacy in the Church

about Biblical Literacy in the Church.

So to give you some background, the Bible Content Exam is one of five exams that those who are seeking ordination as Ministers of Word and Sacrament or Teaching Elders in the PCUSA must take before they are eligible for ordination. The Bible Content Exam is also termed Baby Bible Test. For some it is easy and not a big deal. But for many it is hard because it covers the entirety of the Bible, its history, the overarching themes of books and messages of the prophets as well as understanding Jesus' ministry and the work of the early church. When I took this exam, I was well prepared as I had majored in Biblical Studies at Agnes Scott College. And I had read the Bible twice: once for my year-long Introduction to the Bible class and once for myself. Though I was well versed in the Bible before taking this exam, I still reviewed and did the practice tests that were available. According to the American Bible Society in 2024, fewer Americans than ever are engaging with the Bible, but there's reason for hope. We see a growing interest God's Word among our youngest generation and curiosity in the Movable Middle. This is true in our youth group here at Central. Josie Russell is leading our youth through the book of Luke. They are reading it together and slowly, asking questions and considering its message for our lives. Out of the generosity of Marguerite Buckley, they were given a small book all about the Bible as a reference for their inquiry about the Bible. Our Youth and children want to know more about the Bible, but we as adults also need to be engaging in Bible reading more and learning more about the history, culture and who's who of the Bible.

On Wednesday, May 8, I will be doing a program that I call The Bible in 45 (or so) minutes, where I will start at the very beginning, and tell the entire story of the Bible using flash cards/posters. But it is important to see the whole as well as the individual books of the Bible. This is one of those things I do with the Confirmation class to help them to see the Bible as a whole and not just a bunch of little stories put together, but that there is a reason for them.

Another option is to look at the Bible Project online. The two guys who host these videos provide illustrative telling of the Bible, its themes, word studies, and overviews of each book of the Bible. You can look at these as a part of our Right Now Media subscription (<u>www.rightnowmedia.com</u>) or just google The Bible Project (www.bibleproject.com).

So I want to encourage you to start reading your Bible on a daily basis. You can find online guides as well as simply just start by reading one of the Gospels (personally, I think Luke is the easiest to understand and offers many familiar stories). Make plans now to come and join us on Wednesday, May 8 at 5:30 p.m. for dinner and then let's see if I can actually tell the story of the Bible in 45 (or so) minutes. And maybe we will all learn a little more about the book that is central to our lives and our faith.

These two people set up a nursery and gave away tangerine trees to others in the area. The bandits attacked one of the orchards and the owner tried to defend his trees and home. He was shot and killed, and his wife and another person were wounded. Three people were kidnapped and subsequently released.

We extend our heart-felt sympathy to the people of Madagascar for their losses, and will continue to hold them in our prayers.



The Session met on Tuesday, April 16 at 7 p.m. for the regular monthly meeting. David White opened the meeting with a devotional and opening prayer. We expressed our deepest sympathy to the family and friends of Alice Owenby who died March 22 and to the family and friends of Bessie Kitts who died on March 24, and Vicki and Glenn Myers in the death of Vicki's mom, Jane Coulthard, who was a member of Glad Springs Presbyterian Church. We will have a time of remembrance for them and Mary Kay English as part of our worship on May 26.

Abingdon Presbytery will meet on Thursday, May 9, at Rich Valley Presbyterian Church, Saltville, and John Dodge will be going as our commissioner to that meeting, Barbara Mann will be alternate. John Barker is serving as the Moderator of Presbytery, and Ann Aichinger will go as a minister commissioner.

Ann Aichinger gave her pastoral report and updated everyone on calendar events and plans for the summer. Linda Waldron reported on communications she had received. The Session accepted, with sadness and thanksgiving, the resignation of David White (as of June 30) and Marguerite Buckley (as of April 16) from Session. John Barker gave an update on the Ukrainian situation and the potential of having another Ukrainian family come to Bristol in the summer (watch for more information on this.)

The committees made reports about their work. Fellowship and Dining gave the schedule for Let's Go to Lunch through July and asked that there not be Lemonade in the Shade on those Sundays. Lemonade in the Shade will begin June 2.

Finance Committee recommended two action items: to add John Dodge, retain Paige Thompson and Glen Myers as signers on the accounts; to move a large portion of the Columbarium Fund into an interest bearing instrument. Both were approved. The Nominating Committee will be meeting on Thursday night to begin their work on nominating a slate of elders to be elected by the congregation in June.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 21 at 7 p.m. After sharing pastoral concerns, John Barker closed the meeting with prayer. All were adjourned.
