### Reflections from a Rocking Chair:

May is one of those transitional months. We are moving from regular routines of school and work to times of vacation and taking some time off for rest and renewal. May is the month for graduations as students make transitions from one institution to



another, whether that be from high school to college or to work, or from college into the workforce or graduate school. May is also a month for weddings where couples are joined together because of their love and commitment to one another, and they transition into a new stage of their life together.

May is also a transitional month for the church. We move from Eastertide to Pentecost, from the season of celebrating the resurrection of Jesus to the birth of the church by coming of the Spirit. We also conclude our Wednesday night programs because we know lives of families and individuals gets busier with the coming of summer. We as a church family move from a time of Easter to considering what it means to be the people of God in this time and in this place.

Transitions are often hard. Whether it means changing jobs or retirement, or moving to a new place or even having things shift in our families as children and grandchildren grow up. Yet our lives are full of transitions and changes. As human, we will say we don't like change, but our lives are continually changing. And that means we are called to adapt to the new ahead of us as well as release the old so that we can move forward.

In the life of the early church, Pentecost was a radical shift in how everything was done. No longer would the community of Jesus followers be small and located in Jerusalem. But with the coming of the Holy Spirit, suddenly the community explodes and includes more and more people from more diverse backgrounds and cultures. The disciples are sent further and further away from the center of action (Jerusalem) to the far points of the Roman Empire and beyond.

As we prepare for Pentecost on May 19, I hope that we, too, will be open to the movement of the Spirit among us. I hope that we will allow space and opportunity to be about new things happening in our church and in our community. I am reminded every Sunday how we are called to go back into the world and to share the good news of Jesus Christ. For each of us, that is done in different ways. For some, it is about serving in the community and caring for the least among us. For others, it is about helping the work of Central to reach into our world through prayer and by caring for one another. For others, it is about raising up leadership and training our children and youth in developing their faith. For others, it is in sharing through music as well as in on-going projects and missions.

I believe God continues to call us to live into the new thing that God is doing. But that means that we might have to let go of the old way of doing things and try something new. It usually challenges us to step out on faith even when we are not sure where we are going, but to trust that God is leading us into the new.

So pay attention to the transitions happening in your life and in our world. Pay attention to the transitions happening in our life together at Central. Then watch for how God is at work doing new things in the midst of those changes. For the Spirit is at work, and is challenging us all to live into the newness offered by Christ.

I hope to see you on Pentecost Sunday (May 19). You are encouraged to wear red as it is the color for the Holy Spirit.
