

Reflections From a Rocking Chair

"Practice makes perfect!" a wise saying when applied to learning to play tennis or golf, when learning to play the piano or violin, or learning to draw or even to learn to write or read. Everything takes practice because then you have muscle memory on how to do it. I know practice improves one's skill, but as a beginning artist, I don't live by that saying at all. I know I would get better if I had drawing time everyday. But some days and even weeks have no time for that. So then when I do sit down to draw again, it is like starting over and relearning the basics.

As followers of Christ, we, too, have to practice our faith. It is not something that just happens. But in the good times, we need to pray daily and read the Bible and learn about God's love and grace. For it is this practice that comes into play when we hit difficult times or times when we feel alone or abandoned by God or overwhelmed by life. That is why we have spiritual practices.

This summer, I will be preaching on 8 different spiritual practices that we as a church and as individuals are to have as a part of our life as followers of Christ. Each one is connected to the others and helps us to grow fully as Christians. This last Sunday I started with Radical Welcome, which is more than just saying, "glad you are here," or having greeters at the door. But it is about having an intentional attitude about welcoming everyone into the Kingdom of God.

In today's world, fewer and fewer people are engaged in the life of the local church. The pandemic impacted this, but also the church as an institution has shown itself to be "dangerous" to some, irrelevant to others, and for many, just something that does not make a difference in the world. I think that this is very sad commentary on the church, and I want to challenge us here at Central (and other churches) to truly consider what it might mean to welcome everyone into our fellowship.

I know, Central is well known as a friendly, welcoming church. But that is only if people come. Statistics show that most people would attend worship with a friend if invited. But we as Christians have to extend that invitation to "come with me." Maybe you know someone who does not go to church or have a place of belonging in a faith community. Maybe you live next door to someone who wonders what you are doing when you head out of your house on Sunday mornings and then get home around lunch time. Maybe you work with someone who is struggling and needing to find a place where they can be accepted and loved and cared for. Invite them to join you at worship on a Sunday.

As a part of my sermon, I quoted a welcome statement from a church. It really includes everyone---including you and me. I wanted to have it as a part of this newsletter so you can look at the list of those welcome into the Kingdom of God. Do you see yourself in this list? Do you see your children or grandchildren in this list? Do you know someone who is a part of this list? Then extend a welcome to them to join you at worship.

Sharing the Good news of Jesus Christ is hard work, but that is our job as disciples of Jesus. We are called to share the Good News with people in our local area, in the surrounding areas, and wherever we may go. We are to invite people in and allow them to discover that the church in general, and Central in particular is a place of welcome and safety and where they can belong. So practice inviting someone to join you at worship next week. Let us all live by extending Radical welcome to our neighbors and friends.
