The Session met on Tuesday, June 18 at 7 p.m., hybrid. Ann Aichinger led the devotional and opening prayer. After sharing what question each member would ask God, Ann Aichinger shared her pastoral report. The Session agreed to work with Cause Inspired in obtaining and managing the Google Media Ads Grant for 6 months. This is a way to increase our visibility as a church locally. We discussed when to have Communion in September, as Ann Aichinger will be away on September 1, which is traditionally when we celebrate the sacrament.

The Session called a Congregational meeting on Sunday, July 14, for the purpose of electing new elders to the class of 2027 and one elder for the class of 2026. The Session also approved inviting Abingdon Presbytery for the February 13, 2025 stated meeting to be held at Central. We will have an opportunity to celebrate with them for our 150th anniversary.

John Barker gave and update on the Ukrainian Family situation. The Mashkins are doing very well. All documents have been approved to bring the Moga family to Bristol. We are in need of a host family for them and need to get that set up as soon as possible. If anyone is available or willing to host the Moga's for for 6-8 months, please talk to John Barker or Ann Aichinger.

The committees reported on their work, and after reviewing the calendar, setting Communion servers for July 7, Ann Aichinger shared the pastoral concerns of the church. Glen Van Dyke closed the meeting with prayer and the Session adjourned.


