Update on the Buckner St. Renovation

The renovation of the house at 913 Buckner Street is well into its second month, and we have made great progress! After removing over 70,000 pounds (that's 35 TONS!) of debris from the property, we are now improving and upgrading the house and property.

Thanks to the generosity of Central's members and friends, major upgrades are nearing completion in the entire house. In addition to the plumbing, Robert Taylor and Clark Wilson have worked tirelessly to completely upgrade the wiring, and we are



completing installation of new outlets and light fixtures throughout the house. Clark and David Pattishall-Baker have been waterproofing the walls of the basement.



The other really great news is the fence project, which is scheduled to be installed this week. The fence is critical to making the property safe and free from squatters, and you responded overwhelmingly to my request for funds to build it. Hunt Memorial United Methodist Church and the neighbors have also contributed money to extend the fence across the backyards of all 3 houses on the block.

Central's members have also donated all the paint needed to put two coats on the entire interior and exterior; as well as all the brushes and rollers needed to complete that task. Sherwin-Williams is donating the use of a power washer to clean the exterior before we paint it. We will soon need volunteers to move all the furniture away from the walls before applying the first coat of primer; then folks to help with painting the second coat.

In addition to physical upgrades, our work has helped restore the lives of the family. They are opening up, and their lives are getting brighter every day. We've made friends with this family. All six of them, while still a little shy, are becoming more confident and just *happy* every day. The children and the mother have placed "dibs" on taking the first shower in the nearly-completed bathroom.

We asked for help, and you, the members and friends of Central Presbyterian Church, have poured out an abundance of help and support. Thank you! 
