

Ponderings from a Rocker

September and October are considered the Season of Peace in the PCUSA, which is connected to the Peace and Global Witness offering that we collect on World Communion Sunday, which is Sunday, October 6. The scripture connected to this year's offering is Zechariah 8:12 which reads: "For there shall be a sowing of peace; the vine shall yield its fruit, the ground shall give its produce, and the skies shall give their

dew, and I will cause the remnant of this people to possess all these things." This is a call for the church to be sowing seeds of peace in our communities, in our congregations, in our nation, and throughout the world. But what does this look like?

How do we sow peace in our lives?

Peace is one of those things that is held up as an ideal but seems to be missing in our world. We hear of the lack of peace in places like Ukraine and Sudan, but there are many other places where there is no peace. Our nation is in need of peace, especially in this season of elections, yet it seems that we continue to live in the midst of chaos and confusion. In our community and in our homes, there is a desire for peace, but often we struggle to see any possibility of peace.

Peace is connected to reconciliation which is the work of joining together with others in seeking justice and offering hope, and working to right wrongs. But you may say, "that is too big of a job for me; I'll let someone else do that." And it can be overwhelming when we look at our world and nation, asking, "What can we do to sow peace."

There is folk song that the words are: "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me....." Peace starts with each of us doing something for peace. It might be constantly praying for God's peace to come. It might be working with agencies or local advocates who are working to end violence. It might be in looking at how we spend our money and what companies we are supporting by buying their products (to see if they are involved in supplying instruments of war or aggression.) It might be in responding to the needs of a neighbor who is dealing with issues.

I am so glad that as a church we were willing to say "yes" to help the family living on Buckner Street. Many people have been a part of that project as well as engaging companies and organizations in providing for this family. The house has been greatly improved. The yard is made safe and secure with a new fence. The family is engaging more and willing to be in relationship with their neighbors and our church folks. Is this sowing peace? Yes, for this family did not know peace, and this was spilling over into the neighborhood and causing difficult relationships. But now, as things are improving, neighbors are engaging, and city officials are noticing the improvements of the house as well as the relationships of the family.


Sowing seeds of peace means we are willing to do what seem to be very small things in order for great things to happen. We sow seeds in our gardens and flowerbeds, and we wait, watch and tend to the area hoping for something new to spring up. It is the same with sowing peace. We put our faith in doing small things that can change the course of lives of others and even our own.

Jesus taught in the Beatitudes: "Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9). As a part of being in God's great family, we are to be at work sowing seeds of peace. As we support the Peace and Global Witness Offering, we work with those who are on the frontlines of peacemaking: 25% of our gifts stay in our local community to bring peace to families; 25% is used by the Presbytery and Synod; 50% goes to support the work and efforts around the world.

Thank you for your work in being peacemakers and living as the Children of God.

Exit 29


Turn Right off the Exit


community as well as church are invited to participate. This group will regularly meet on the first and third Wednesdays at 1:30-2:30 p.m. at Central.

Session Notes

Trick or Treat on Euclid Avenue

The Session met on Tuesday, September 17 at 7 p.m. for the regular stated meeting. After a time of sharing, Ann Aichinger reviewed the calendar and reminded Session members about events coming up. John Barker gave the update on the Moga's and their adjustment to being here in Bristol.

Each of the committees was invited to share what is happening. Christian Education shared about upcoming events including Blessing of the Animals on October 6, Trunk or Treat on October 27, and Halloween on Euclid on Oct 31. There will be a Montreat Church family day where everyone it invited to come to Montreat on Saturday, November 9 for fellowship, lunch and time to be in that special place. Finance gave an update on finances, and that we enrolled in the Board of Pensions in the new Congregational Pastor Plan, and that Stewardship Season would be from October 20-November 10 (the theme is *Reaching into our Community: Being a Matthew 25 Church*), which will be Commitment Sunday. The Mission and Outreach Committee reported that the Backpack ministry is supplying 140 bags a week, 30 go to the High School and 110 go to the Elementary School. After reviewing pastoral concerns, Susan Campbelle closed the meeting with prayer. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 15 at 7 p.m.
