#### Called Congregational Meeting, Sunday, January 5, 2024

The Session has called a Congregational Meeting for the purpose of changing the pastor's terms of call due to a change in Medical insurance costs. This meeting will be on Sunday, January 5 immediately following worship.



**Rationale for the meeting:** As your pastor, I am called by the congregation and so any changes to my terms of call (schedule or financial commitment) must be approved by the congregation. In 2025, the Board of Pensions (the PCUSA

organization that covers medical and retirement coverage) has changed the ways medical coverage is calculated. Over the last 35 or more years, a pastor's medical coverage covered by the church has been based on a percentage of Effective Salary (total of salary and housing compensation). This cost has steadily risen to the point that many churches are unable to cover medical insurance for pastors or find it a heavy burden. In 2024, the percentage rate was 39% which includes 10% for retirement and 29% for medical coverage. But with a new structure, the cost for medical coverage is 16% and continuing with the 10% for retirement. So the overall calculations are for 26% of the Effective Salary (salary and housing combined). The difference is \$8950 which the session has reallocated as \$5,000 to my housing and then \$3,950 distributed to the staff to increase their compensation.

I want you to know that this does not change my medical coverage, but reduces the cost to the church. It is the right way for the Board of Pensions to be working within the denomination. I hope you will attend and approve these changes.

On Thursday, Dec 19 at 7 pm, we will have A Longest Night Service of Worship. This is an opportunity for all who find this season difficult or tiresome, who feel the losses in life, and need a place to pause and reflect.

So why have a Longest Night Service? The Christmas season is often marked by expressions of joy, excitement, and happiness. It's a time for family to gather, and for churches to worship pointing to the hope that is found in the coming of

the Christ child. However, this time of joy and expectation can often overshadow the pain and hurt many experience during this season.

It's a worship service scheduled around the winter solstice (the longest night of the calendar) which is December 21. It is noted that this day is the traditional feast day for Saint Thomas the Apostle. This invites us to make some connections between Thomas's struggle to believe the story of Jesus' resurrection, the long nights just before Christmas, and the struggle with darkness and grief faced by those living with loss.

This service is a witness to all that the Christ child comes as a sign of hope in the face of despair. It is a way for our church family to acknowledge the various seasons of life that people may find themselves in. You are invited to come away from the busy-ness of the season, to reflect and remember, and to see that the light of Christ does come into our darkness. All are welcomed to this service. It will be about 45 minutes in length and held in Central Hall.
