From the Rocking Chair

As we start this new year, we are beginning a special season for the life of Central Presbyterian Church. This is our 150th Anniversary of our first worship service on January 26, 1875. So as we gather on Sunday, Jan 26, 2025, we will have a special worship gathering in the Sanctuary, where a new hymn written by Robert Campbelle will be presented and sung by the congregation for this occasion. Also, Rev. Ann Elyse Hicks, Abingdon Presbytery Leader, will be here to preach and celebrate with us.

So the original story of Central goes like this. A group of people left First Presbyterian Church because they were denied access to receiving the Lord's Supper due to their participation in some "unacceptable behaviors" like dancing, playing cards and betting on elections. Not that they were not faithful, but they were not going to set up boundaries within the community of faith as to who would be accepted and who would not. They started a new church in Bristol, VA (once known as Goodson, VA), and named it Second Presbyterian. Then they realized that they were second to none, and instead they were Central. On January 26, 1875, they chartered as a church and had their first worship. They built the wooden church on the corner of Cumberland and Moore Streets. This church burned down and within a year and a half, they rebuilt the brick church on the same site, and worshiped there until 1948 when Central moved out to Euclid Avenue.

This church has had a long history of making a difference in this community. We have sought to open our doors to anyone and everyone and to make this a place where people can belong. It is a place where questions are welcomed, and where we seek to learn together about how best to live as God's people. As I have been a part of the life of this congregation, first as a child from 1973-1985, and now as your pastor since 2014, I have seen the many ways this church continues to live faithfully into the calling of Christ.

The theme for our year of celebrations is Faithful Past, Joyful Future. Throughout this year, we hope to have special events as a part of a year-long celebration. Sunday January 26 will be the kick-off for our festivities. After worship on that day, everyone is invited to come to Eggs Up (near Kroger) for brunch. We have reserved the large room for our group. No need to make reservations. Just come and enjoy the fellowship. On Thursday, February 13, we will host Abingdon Presbytery for the stated meeting. As a part of this time, we will highlight some of our history as well as what we are doing currently in ministry.

The big celebration weekend will be May 16-18. We will send out invitations to our local friends and church family as well as those who have been connected with our church through the years. We hope to have all living former pastors present for worship on Sunday, May 18. We are still working on plans for the weekend, but we hope to have a concert or music event as well as a dinner or picnic as a part of the schedule. If you have ideas for this weekend's events or other times in the year, please talk to me, and let's see what we can do to celebrate the life and future of our church.

We have lived a faithful past, and we are looking ahead to a joyful future. As we move through this year, I invite you to reconnect and recommit to our ministry and work together. One hundred and fifty years is a long time to be present in a community, but we know that going forward, we will seek to remain faithful to God's calling and joyfully serve in new ways and areas as needs arise.

As it is a joy to serve with you in ministry, I am looking forward to the many ways we will celebrate together our past, our present and look with joy to our future.

Sermon: Jan 12

Great Expectations Luke 3:15-17, 21-22 Sanctuary with Communion

Sermon series:



Canned meat (tuna, ham, chicken, beef stew, Spam)

Canned vegetables

Canned pork and beans

Canned fruit (no fruit cups)

Dry rice or pasta

Instant mashed potatoes (plain or flavored)

Spaghetti sauce (no glass jars)

Cereal (hot and cold)

Jelly and peanut butter

Breakfast bars/granola bars

Macaroni and cheese (preferably not needing milk or butter)

Pantry staples (small containers of flour, salt and pepper, sugar, catsup, oil, etc.)

Please do not bring anything in glass jars; they tend to break and are hard to handle.
