This has been a long season of Epiphany, from January 12-March 4. But it is that in between time from Christmas to Lent. The length of Epiphany actually depends on the date of Easter and the season of Lent. But maybe it has been a necessary part of this year. Epiphany is associated with Light in all its forms. From nightlights that help us to find our way in our homes at night, to stars in the night sky that seem to be lining up for a celestial display, to traffic lights that guide us in our travels to sunlight that helps us navigate through the day. And if you have noticed, in the evening, the light lingers a bit longer, and the sunset is a bit later. Light is one of those things that we take for granted, and yet, without light, we would be blind.

The liturgical color for Epiphany is green, which signifies growth and change. I find this interesting since, we are usually in the middle of winter and there is little growth happening. Yet, maybe it is a reminder of the hope to come with spring and a challenge for us to be watching for those places of growth in our lives and in creation and in the world. In late January and early February we had a spell of warm weather, and it was as if flowers and plants and trees were being tricked into thinking it was time to bud and bloom. Even my lilac bushes have a bit of new growth on them. But with the cold snaps and snows that growth has halted and I hope the flowers won't be injured. But we will have to see.

Epiphany has been that season to see things anew and hopefully to hear things anew. As a part of worship, we have been looking at the topic of leadership in the church and how each of us is called to lead in the world as Christians. Then on Wednesday nights, we have been looking at our spiritual gifts, and how we are called to use them for the good of everyone. Maybe we have been seeking to see ourselves and those around us in new ways and to see how God is at work in us doing new things.

As we are concluding Epiphany, worship on Sunday, February 23 will focus on Love. But love is not to be hold only for those we like or those who like us. But we are challenged to extend our love to include even those who are considered enemies. And this is the hard part of the Gospel, when we are to live in new ways in sharing the Good News.

February is associated with Love because of Valentine's Day. But as I say to the Apple children in Monday Chapel, Valentine's Day is not the only day to love. We are to love every day, even when we don't feel like being loving. Love is an action word, not just an emotion. Love is a way of life. Love is a decision we make each and every day. And it is not easy. Especially when we seek to live into the light of Christ in this world, sharing of what we know and what we have heard.

So as we come to the end of Epiphany, and as we enter Lent, we are encouraged to continue to live into the Light of Christ, and to shine our light wherever we go. In shining our light, may others see the Love of God in us as we seek to respond to the needs around us.

Thank you for being a church that is willing to go into some dark places and places in need of love and grace. Thank you for being a church that hears the call to be engaged outside of the walls of the church building, sharing Christ's love and mercy. Thank you for being a church that seeks to make a difference in our local community but also willing to impact our world. May we continue to follow the winds of the Spirit which guides us in our work and ministry.

Following the Congregational Meeting, there will be the Annual Meeting of the Corporation. All members of the church are encouraged to be in attendance.




