Maybe it is deciding to reconnect with people in your life by writing a note or an email to check in on them and tell them the difference their friendship makes for your life. Maybe it is getting involved in a community project to work on justice issues for our neighbors. Everyone is welcome to join us for dinner and the service in Central Hall as we start this new season for our life together.

A Moment in History...

A change in the name of the church: from the Centennial History (1875-1975) pages 15-17

The years from 1891-1899 were, perhaps the darkest days in Central's history. The members drifted away; some moved from the area and others transferred their membership other church; some died; until all there was left was one elder, Victor Doriot, plus 5 stouthearted believers. The church almost disbanded, for no progress was being made. Presbytery, realizing that that the dissolution of Central Church was probably imminent, asked the 6 remaining members their views about the possible action. Mr. Doriot and his family stated emphatically that they would not be dissolved, and if the old ship of Zion went down, they would go with it; so the continuity of the organization was preserved......

Among the members of the then faltering church in the last years of the century was a professor at King College, William Henry Tappey Squires. He had served as a deacon, and no doubt became fired up with the zeal to help save "the old ship of Zion." At any rate, he came as pastor immediately following his graduation from Union Theological Seminary (Richmond, VA), and had a thunderbolt hit the little congregation, the result could scarcely have been more electrifying. Mr. Squire must have had that rare ability to lead without arrogance and to organize without regimentation, for the church underwent a revival which brought new life and zeal to its members and to the community. ...

From the beginning of his pastorate, Mr. Squires began the publication of a church letter called "the Covenanter." In its pages, he praised the good work going on, mentioned advertisers, raising certain needs of the church. He also decried certain activities in the community such as attending carnivals, and among the members, such as stinginess of time and of the pocketbook. Within the early publications, there was expressed a dissatisfaction among the members with the name "Second Presbyterian Church." Mr. Squires made it clear that no change would be made until the vote to change was unanimous. The vote was taken on January 15, 1902 to request the Presbytery to change the name to "Central Presbyterian Church." Mr. Squires wrote in the church newsletter that the "name should be changed from Second Presbyterian --which we never were---to Central Presbyterian--which we have always been." The action was most significant for it suggested new life, unity, energy and determination to succeed which had taken possession of the congregation. In Mr. Squires words: "we haven't a single 'croaker'--and we don't want any. The Church is moving forward with an impetus that nothing can defeat. 'The Lord is my banner '(Exodus 17:15) is our motto and in His name we set up our standard."

Lenten Devotionals:

We have three devotionals available this year. For those with children, we have <u>Stepping Stones</u> through <u>Lent</u>. We have a large print option, <u>A Season of Grace</u>. Then the regular devotionals is Savior, Servant and Friend.

The Shiny GOAT Award from Thriving Congregations Project

For the last three years we have been a part of the Thriving Congregations Project out of Montreat Conference Center and the Black Mountain School of Theology and Communities. We have had a team go for training 6 times as well as having on going coaching on a monthly basis. As a part of this project, we have identified that food insecurity is the key issue for us as a church to seek to address, and connected to food issues is also housing, transportation and industry. In mid-February, Robert Campbelle attended the cohort gathering, and he presented the whole vision of where Central is at work and what we are seeking to be a part of. As a recognition of our work, we were given a Shiny GOAT



award for "Our Belief that there are no limitations or boundaries to what we can do with the Spirit of God." Tim Conder and Dan Rhodes of the Thriving Congregations faculty said of Central---"you all simply don't think that there are any limits to what you can do—and you are open to the new opportunities that come your way."
