History Moment of Central Presbyterian Church: Do You Know...?

That the banners in Central Hall tell a story about who we are as a church: that we are Worshiping Community, we are a learning community where the faith is taught, we seek to build community inside the church and with our neighbors outside the church, and that we seek to share the Good News of Jesus in our work and service and words;



That the organ in the Sanctuary was purchased in 1961 and is one of the premier pipe organs in the area;

The 6 banners in the Sanctuary illustrate the Great Ends of the Church and were designed and created by three women in Central as a way to enhance our worship time. (note that the common element in the banners is the dove that represents the Holy Spirit);

Central has had a 7 women who have gone into ordained PCUSA ministry: Dr. Lucy Rose, Dr. Frances Taylor Gench, Rev. Jamie Butcher, Rev. Ann Fitzgerald Aichinger, Rev. Polly Deppen, Rev. Katherine Campbell and Rev. Victoria Krebs;


Apple Preschool moved to Central in 1986, and has been able to provide early childhood education for many children of our local community through the years;

That the butterfly garden on the bank in the alleyway was an Eagle Scout project by our own Becka Reese;

That there was a wedding at the Euclid building in the basement before the Sanctuary was completed;

That Central hosted a Boy Scout troop and a Girl Scout troop as well as had a church basketball team for the local league;

That the bell in the steeple came from the original church, and we now ring it on Sunday mornings as we begin worship and at the end of worship.
