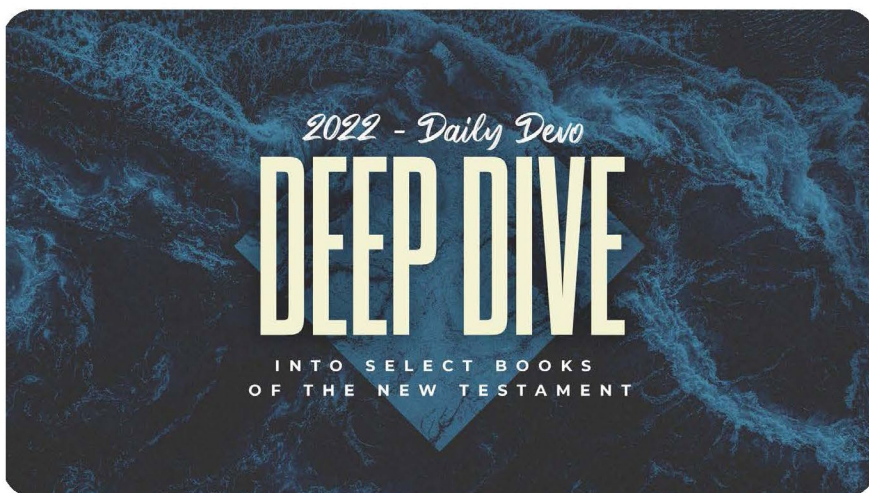
WELCOME TO **WILLOWBROOK**
