2/9	F	Mark	3	Jesus appoints the twelve apostles, heals many, confronts accusations of collusion with Beelzebul, and redefines His family.
2/12	М	Mark	4	Jesus teaches in parables including the Sower, the Lamp, the Growing Seed, and the Mustard Seed, and calms a storm on the sea.
2/13	T	Mark	5	Jesus heals a demon-possessed man, raises Jairus' daughter, and heals a woman with a bleeding issue.
2/14	W	Mark	6	Jesus is rejected in Nazareth, sends out the Twelve, Herod beheads John the Baptist, Jesus feeds 5,000, and walks on water.
2/15	Th	Mark	7	Jesus teaches about inner purity over tradition, heals a Syrophoenician woman's daughter, and a deaf and mute man.



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2/16	F	Mark	8	Jesus feeds 4,000, confronts the Pharisees, heals a blind man, Peter declares Jesus as Christ, and Jesus predicts His death.
2/19	М	Mark	9	Transfiguration of Jesus, healing of a demon-possessed boy, Jesus teaches about greatness and warns against causing sin.
2/20	Т	Mark	10	Jesus teaches about marriage and divorce, blesses children, speaks with a rich young ruler, predicts His death, and heals blind Bartimaeus.
2/21	W	Mark	11	Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, curses a fig tree, clears the temple, and teaches on faith and prayer.
2/22	Th	Mark	12	Jesus tells the Parable of the Tenants, answers questions about taxes, the resurrection, and the greatest commandment, and commends the widow's offering.
2/23	F	Mark	13	Jesus predicts the destruction of the temple and discusses signs of the end times, urging vigilance and readiness.
2/26	М	Mark	14	The plot to kill Jesus, the Last Supper, Jesus prays in Gethsemane, His arrest, Peter's denial, and Jesus before the Sanhedrin.

3/5	Т	Luke	4	Jesus is tempted by Satan in the wilderness. Jesus begins his public ministry, performs miracles, and preaches in synagogues.
3/6	W	Luke	5	Jesus calls his first disciples. performs miracles, and shares the parable of the new wine in old wineskins.
3/7	Th	Luke	6	Jesus teaches about love, forgiveness, and compassion. He chooses the twelve apostles; and heals and teaches the crowds that follow him.
3/8	F	Luke	7	Jesus heals a Centurion's servant and raises a widow's son. He answers messengers sent by John the Baptist, and speaks of forgiveness.
3/11	М	Luke	8	The parables of the sower, lamp, and storm. Jesus casts out demons. He heals a woman in the crowd, as well as Jairus' daughter.
