

A Display of God's Faithfulness Part 2


The Last Supper tradition began in 1961 when the Women of the Church (WOC) were hosting monthly programs of inspiration and topics related to the church. Betty Jean Rodgers, Director of Christian Education at that time, suggested a script given to her by a friend - *The Last Supper*, written by Ernest K. Emurian. Myrtle Cashion (WOC President), Dot Williams (WOC Vice President), and Iris Efird (past WOC President) reviewed the script and discussed its possibilities. Dot's husband, August Williams, proposed letting the Men of the Church work with the women to make the presentation even more effective and meaningful. According to Myrtle's notebook, those laying the groundwork for this endeavor were: Dot Williams, Effie Eudy, Bobbie Karriker, Phyllis White, Lela Bishop, Betty Jean Rodgers, Iris Efird, F. J. INTERNATIONAL RELIEF

Donations for Ukraine relief are now being accepted, and will be sent to Samaritan's Purse. When the Russian invasion began, Samaritan's Purse was in the process of distributing 600,000 Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes. Their "disaster response specialists" are in place in Poland, Romania, and Moldova. Additionally, they have now set up an Emergency Field Hospital outside Lviv, and a clinic at Lviv train station. Their desire is "to meet the needs of these families in their darkest moments while pointing them to the light and hope of Jesus Christ."
