Journey Youth, family, and friends are invited to Faith Fest, a Christian music worship event on Saturday, September 16 in Wilkesboro, NC!



Sasha Tsutserov, President of the Moscow Evangelical Christian Seminary, writes: "Thank you for fulfilling the Great Commission, 'Go and make disciples of all nations' (Matthew 28:19) together with us, First Presbyterian Church!" Since 1993, the seminary has been training over 500 full -time students across 11 time zones in Eastern Europe. Of nearly 1,000 graduates, 15% are pastors, 43% are bi-vocational pastors,

24% are on staff at parachurch organizations, and 6% are missionaries. The new Mission Program established last year has also graduated 51 students! Your mission dollars have supported the Seminary in years past, including \$1,000 this year from the Missions budget.
