


THE WEEKLY FIRST



Sunday, we will end our series on the "Moses Story". In the future I will come back to the book of Exodus and teach the "Moses Story", Part 2. Last week, both on Wednesday and Sunday I taught on the plagues with a focus on the meaning of the Passover. Two of the three world's monotheistic religions, Judaism and Christianity, commemorate the Passover with Christians celebrating Jesus' revised version as He is the Once-and-For-All Passover Lamb.

This Sunday, we will follow the "Moses Story" into Exodus 14 as he leads God's people out of Egypt. Early on the journey out of Egypt toward the Promised Land, Moses and the Israelites learned "The Real Battle" they faced as they transitioned from an oppressed people to a free people and newly formed nation under God. It is the "Real Battle" we face in living life that is truly life in our days.

October 27 is also a Sunday many Protestant churches celebrate Reformation Day. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 Thesis/Protests on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany. These protests were surreptitiously printed into the German language and became a catalyst for a movement which eventually became widely known as the Protestant Reformation.

Luther, Calvin, Zwingli and the other Reformers believed the church of their day was drifting away from the essential and foundational truths of the Christian Faith. Guided by biblical convictions, the reformers sought to reorient Christianity on the foundations of the Apostles and Prophets with Jesus Christ as the Chief Cornerstone (Ephesians 2:19). The five "Solas" (Latin phrases) summarizing the core theological convictions of the Protestant Reformation are as follows:

□ Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone): The Bible alone is our highest authority.

□ Sola Fide (Faith Alone): We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ.

□ Sola Gratia (Grace Alone): We are saved by the grace of God alone.


□ Solis Christus (Christ Alone): Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King.

□ Soli Deo Gloria (To the Glory of God alone): We live for the

glory of God alone.

Attached is a brief biographical sketch of Martin Luther and his spiritual struggle that led to his conversion and was a catalyst to what we call the Protestant Reformation.




MARK YOUR CALENDAR FOR THESE IMPORTANT OCC DATES:




