

# THE WEEKLY FIRST



Last Sunday I ended the series, "The Moses Story" Part 1. Into the new year, I will teach Part 2. This Sunday we will look at Luke 5:27-32 and other occasions when Jesus fellowshipped with questionable kinds of folks. Jesus was accused of having dinner with all the wrong kinds of people. "The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and you say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners." (Luke 7:34) Sunday we will think on a few "Dinners with Jesus".

I look forward to worshipping with you Sunday. Our music Sunday will feature a bagpiper. In addition to worshipping God and thinking on His Word, we will give thanks for those in our church family who have served our country. We will have a special prayer for our nation.

I also want to give a special invitation to "Saturday Game Night" this Saturday, November 9 at 6:30pm in the Fellowship Hall.

As the election has ended, I offer a few post-election comments. Below are a few thoughts on the "Bible and Politics" written by a friend of mine and a former Associate Pastor, Matt Kuiken with whom I worked alongside several years ago. If you would like the whole article, let me know and I will email it to you.

**Remember the main headline: Jesus is King.** Often in American politics, each election is made out to be an apocalyptic event. If this party gains or loses power, the world will end. No, it won't. As the saying goes, "The sky won't fall until Jesus falls from it." Jesus is King and His purposes will be accomplished. After November 5th, not one spiritual reality will have shifted or changed.

**Pray.** The greatest political influence we have is not our vote (though important) it is our prayers. 1 Timothy 2:1 says, "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good and pleasing in the sight of God our Savior." We must pray for the election and pray for the candidates. We must pray that God would give them salvation, wisdom, righteousness and discernment. After Election Day, we must pray for those who have been elected to have wisdom to

govern righteously. Prayer is the single greatest thing we can do.

**Serve Politically.** We need Christians who will serve in the political arena. This is not an easy calling. But Joseph, Daniel and Esther are three examples of faithful servants of God who made a tremendous impact in the political realm.

**Prize Character.** One of the political lessons of Israel's history is that people inevitably reflect the character of their leaders. For this reason, the character of a political candidate is not a secondary issue. Proverbs 29:12 says, "*If a ruler listens to falsehood, all his officials will be wicked.*" In other words, the character of leaders is contagious.

**Respect Life.** The primary role of all political authority is to protect the lives of its citizens. Christian citizens have a responsibility from God to value the lives of the most vulnerable and those that society tends to overlook.

**Respect Conscience.** Our consciences and our reason should be informed by Scripture and prayer. We should respect differences in conscience among Christians. A candidate that you may not feel comfortable voting for, another person will. Don't try to bind another's conscience with your opinion.

**Maintain a Kingdom Mindset.** Political events have real consequences and should be taken seriously. But as Christians, we know the things that are most essential to our lives – things like: truth, salvation, true security, God-given identity – these are firmly fixed in Christ. Therefore, we must heed the words of Jesus, "Seek first God's kingdom and His righteousness" (Matthew 6:33) for no political party or human government can give us these things.


