**Children's Church** is available for children 4 years through 2nd grade. After the "Word with our Children", they will be escorted to their classroom in the Nursery.


**A Nursery** is available for newborns through age 4. It is located in the Educational Building. If you need assistance or directions, an usher would be happy to help you!

## The beautiful Chrismons that adorn our sanctuary tree are lovingly cared for by the women of the

**church.** Chrismons are symbols that point to the Good News of the Gospel. They are traditionally white (representing purity or holiness) and gold (representing majesty and glory of the triune God) in color. Each week during Advent, we will feature one Chrismon. This week, as we think on the peace Christ offers us, we consider the angel. Angels are woven throughout the Christmas story. An angel appeared to Zacharias to foretell the

birth of John the Baptist. The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to announce that she would bear God's Son. And of course, they brought news of Jesus' birth to the shepherds. But in each of these encounters, the angels also reminded their audience not to be afraid. The peace of God drives out our fear, guarding our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus!
