Article 18 of the Belgic Confession

Leader: Christians, what do we believe concerning the Incarnation?

Children's Church is available for children 4 years through 2nd grade. After the "Word with our Children", they will be escorted to their classroom in the Nursery.


A Nursery is available for newborns through age 4. It is located in the Educational Building. If you need assistance or directions, an usher would be happy to help you!

The beautiful Chrismons that adorn our sanctuary tree are lovingly cared for by the women of the

church. Chrismons are symbols that point to the Good News of the Gospel. They are traditionally white (representing purity or holiness) and gold (representing majesty and glory of the triune God) in color. Each week during Advent, we will feature one Chrismon. This week, as we celebrate the joy Christ brings to our life, we consider the star. Of course, during the Christmas season, we immediately think of the star that drew the wise men

to Jerusalem, seeking the King of the Jews. The nativity star chrismon represents this star. Other stars you may see include: 5-point star, representing the number of wounds Jesus received on the cross; 6-point star (star of David), reminding us of the creation story and Jesus' lineage from King David; or 8-point star, symbolizing regeneration and baptism. As we celebrate the joy Christ's first coming brings to our lives, we also look with joyful anticipation to the day He - the "bright Morning Star" - returns. (Revelation 22:16)






