A Nursery is available for newborns through age 4. It is located in the Educational Building. If you need assistance or directions, an usher would be happy to help you!





The beautiful Chrismons that adorn our sanctuary tree are lovingly cared for by the women of the


church. Chrismons are symbols that point to the Good News of the Gospel. They are traditionally white (representing purity or holiness) and gold (representing majesty and glory of the triune God) in color. Each week during Advent, we will feature one Chrismon. This week, as we celebrate the love of God, we think on the cross.

The cross has become a universal symbol of Christianity, reminding us of the salvation Jesus was born to accomplish. A simple cross represents Jesus' crucifixion. Crosses with added embellishments point us to other facets of our faith and Christ's work. For example, a cross with a circle represents eternity. A cross with a sunburst behind it reminds us of Christ's resurrection from the dead. A cross with other crosses at each point symbolizes the Gospel's spread "to the ends of the earth" - North, South, East, and West. (Acts 1:8) A cross with no top point (Tau cross) reminds us that Jesus' salvation work is not yet fully accomplished. A Tau cross with a serpent corresponds with John 3:14, *"Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."* And any cross reminds us that Jesus' sacrifice was because "God so loved the world..." (John 3:16) There is no greater love because God IS love!
