

Two very important church updates.

Update on Kay Yates: At the end of April, Kay, our Director of Music, will be transitioning out of her leadership role and hopefully into a role that gives her more flexibility to travel and do other things with her husband, Dennis. One of the challenges of church ministry is Sunday comes around every week. For many of us Kay is not our music person, she is part of our church family. The elders and I hope she will remain on as our organist and participate in other ways. While I do not want to pressure Kay to stick around and help us into the future, I hope you will.

Michelle and I wrote the job description for the new position, and the Session approved it a few weeks ago. We have begun to search and have interviewed two people. Michelle and I are vetting the resumes, arranging interviews and elder Cookie Hamilton is participating in the interviews. Presently, we are not receiving many applicants. We will try to keep you updated.

I have attached our job description. Feel free to offer your insights and pass it along to anyone you may know who would be interested. We have put it on Indeed, as well as sent it to schools in the area. We are searching for a person who excels in playing a variety of traditional hymns and songs, can lead small choral groups and a choir and help plan our worship services.

New After-school program: Several months ago, I met Tony Peek and since then I have spent hours with him. He is a man with an extraordinary story of God's grace who has a passion for the education and flourishing of children and youth.

When I met Tony he had been looking for a place and a partner for an inaugural after-school program in this area. I introduced him to our Session and last Fall our Session agreed to partner with him by offering three rooms on our lower floor to be used Tuesday-Thursday afternoons, times when our building is not in use. I have committed to do what I can to encourage him.

Starting something new in this area is not for the faint of heart, even a program so desperately needed. Tony has spent months meeting Cabarrus and Kannapolis school and community leaders with differing degrees of success. His hope is to begin March 4. Presently he has around 10 students signed up with the hope of having 30 students by the beginning of the after-school program in March.

What does the program mean for our church? Practically, our Session has committed the use of our Fellowship Hall (brief time of welcome and snacks) and three rooms on three afternoons (Tuesday-Thursday) in which the building is not in regular use. My prayer is in time, as the program begins to grow, some of you may find a place to serve, a young person to love or families for which to pray.

In the church I served in Fort Myers, New Hope Presbyterian, we entered into a relationship with the poorest school in Fort Myers. We wrote, developed and implemented a mentoring program for every fifth-grade student at Colonial Elementary school for years. The school was impacted and even more our people were the one's most blessed. Pastorally, I see it as an opportunity to get to know every student and parent and encourage them anyway I can. The goal is not to get people to come to our church, but that they will know they are welcomed to our church.

Why partner with starting an after-school program? The Prophet Jeremiah was raised up by God during a time of the exile. After Jerusalem was destroyed in 587 BC, the Jews were deported and exiled to Babylon. They wanted to leave Babylon and go back where they nostalgically dreamed of life as it was in Jerusalem. God's Word to His people during this time is relevant to God's people in all time. "This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: "Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce....seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper." (Jeremiah 29:5-7) As a community of Christians, we want to attempt big and small things to participate in God's global mission which includes seeking the flourishing of this community.


The Missions Team is sponsoring a "Souper Bowl of Caring" to "tackle hunger" in our community!
