


THE WEEKLY FIRST



I look forward to our worship on Sunday, Feb. 16. Attached in our "Weekly First" email is the bulletin. I do not always take sufficient time to announce the ministries and activities in our church. I urge you to read what's going on and consider how you can participate. On Sunday, our children and Abigail will sing, while Amelia will play piano. During the teaching time, we will continue our series on Galatians.

In the New Testament book of Galatians, God teaches Christians how to believe and live the gospel. The Gospel is the "power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes." (Romans 1:16) Believing the Gospel is also our spiritual power for living our salvation. This is the truth Paul is teaching in Galatians 3.

The Galatian Christians had come under the influence of false teachers who insisted that, in addition to believing in Jesus, His followers must also become religious and cultural Jews. Your acceptance by God came from believing in Jesus plus religion. Paul's response was blunt – "Are you so foolish? After beginning with the Spirt, are you now trying to attain your goal by human effort?" (Gal. 3:3)

God's Gospel is an "as-if-God's -grace -plus -nothing- gospel." By faith in Christ and nothing else, we are declared righteous "as if" we lived a perfect life. By faith in Christ and nothing else, we are forgiven "as if" we paid the penalty for our sin. By faith in Christ and nothing else, we are spiritually united with the risen, ascended Christ "as if" we rose again from death to life. Doctrinally, the truth is "union with Christ." By faith in Christ and nothing else, we are now "in Christ" and "Christ is in us."

"Christians think that we are saved by the gospel, but then we grow by applying Biblical principles to every area of our life. But we are not just saved by the gospel, we grow by living the gospel into every area of our lives." (Paul Kauffman). We spiritually grow the same way we become a Christian, by believing the truth of the gospel. "In Christ" we have a new identity; we are forgiven, family and forever. We have a new spiritual life and power for living, "Christ in us."

Jesus says, "Remain in Me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in Me. 'I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in Me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from Me you can do nothing." (John 15:4-5) "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." (Galatians 2:20)

This Sunday, we will continue to consider how the Gospel spiritually grows us.


You are invited to "Forever Fifties," an Agape Bistro presented by First Pres PraiseMakers and friends!
