


## THE WEEKLY FIRST



As Jesus made His journey toward the Cross at the climax of human history, Jerusalem and surrounding areas were filled with a palpable spirit of anticipation and anger. John 12, the chapter on which our teaching is based for Sunday, captures a glimpse of this spirit. Jesus had just raised Lazarus from the dead. In the ancient day of misinformation, Lazarus' death and aliveness were indisputable. Four days he was dead.

As John 12 opens, Lazarus is having dinner with Jesus and his sisters, Martha and Mary, in his hometown of Bethany. At this dinner in Jesus' honor, Mary anoints Jesus pouring a pint of expensive perfume on Him which dripped from His head to His feet. It was a beautiful display of extravagant devotion in response to Jesus' radical love. Of course, beauty is in the eye of the beholder so not everyone thought Mary's display was an act of devotion. Judas thought it a waste of money that could have been invested in ministering to the poor. He would have had a point except Judas was no wise steward but a thief.

As Jesus blesses Mary's devotion, His journey moves from messianic anticipation to religious anger. Anger is not only mounting against Jesus, but plans are being made to murder Lazarus. Lazarus was a living illustration of Jesus' claims and power. Jews "were going over to Jesus and putting their faith in Him" (John 12:10). The next day as crowds arrived for the Passover feast, Jesus publicly and confrontationally entered Jerusalem declaring Himself the Messiah King and the crowds erupted, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the King of Israel"! (John 12:13)

The "die was cast". It was Sunday but Friday was coming! Jerusalem, already a powder keg, filled with Jewish pilgrims to celebrate Passover and Jewish hatred and zealotry against Roman occupation, became more volatile with religious rage against Jesus and messianic expectations for Jesus.

Ironically, as Jewish leaders conspired to eliminate Lazarus and Jesus, Gentile God-seekers came to Jesus' disciples. "We want to see Jesus". (John 12:21 "Jesus replied, The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." (John 12:23) "Hour", this is a reference to the Father's Mission and the Son's manifest destiny.

Gentile God-fearers want to see Jesus. Jesus' response, "it's time for me to die". Jesus said, "Amen" or "Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds." (John 12:24)

This is one of Jesus' Amen truths. Often when Jesus spoke a solemn word, He affirmed the veracity and gravity of His statement preceding it with "Amen". Indirectly, Jesus is claiming He speaks for God as God in the flesh. Practically, the "Amen" truths are like Jesus grabbing us by the lapels and saying, "listen up". This Sunday we will look at this Amen truth and the larger passage which reveals it.

#### **Your Mission Team News**

Our mission: "To be Christ's witnesses in Kannapolis, Rowan; Cabarrus counties, and even to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Russia, with its 11 time zones, seems like the "ends of the earth" and maybe an unlikely place for our mission support, but there is exciting work (God's work) happening in Moscow, Russia and

the former Soviet Union countries, such as Ukraine, Moldova, and Armenia. We support one student a year at the Moscow Evangelical Christian Seminary (est. 1993) through the One Mission Society. Sasha, their director, has spoken to us in previous years about the challenges and triumphs of RE-growing the Christian church in Russia after decades of persecution.

Currently there are 700 students enrolled. Tuition costs \$1,200/year/student (a 3-yr program) for training full-time pastors, bi-vocational pastors and missionaries.

6:30pm – Worship Service in Sanctuary


