


THE WEEKLY FIRST



This Sunday, we enter with Jesus into Jerusalem, beginning the celebration of what Christians have come to know as Holy Week. We will wave palm branches and add our own "Hosanna" to the King who came lowly and riding on a donkey. Sunday night during The Last Supper presentation, we will contemplate Jesus' betrayal by one of His own disciples, acknowledging that we "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

On Maundy Thursday, we will commemorate the New Covenant made in Jesus' body and His blood, ourselves partaking of the bread and the cup during the Lord's Supper. Good Friday worship is at Kimball Memorial Lutheran with the congregations of St. John's Reformed and Second Presbyterian. We will mourn Jesus' death on the cruel cross of Golgotha and acknowledge our own sin before a Holy and Righteous God. Saturday, while we wait for the promise of the resurrection, our youth, their families, and friends are all invited to an Easter Celebration. We will play games, enjoy crafts, and contemplate Jesus' love for us, complete with a cookout and special treats. Next Sunday, we will rejoice in Jesus' triumphant resurrection as we worship the God who conquered sin and death so that we might have eternal and everlasting "life that is truly life!" All the while, we remember that "it was for this very reason" Jesus "came to this hour." (John 12:27) Please join us for these meaningful times of corporate worship. In the week to come, may we focus our hearts on God's love, Jesus' sacrificial and atoning death, His finished work on the cross, His glorious resurrection and ascension, and His promise to come again. "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!"(2 Corinthians 9;15)

The Last Supper Palm Sunday, April 13 at 7:30pm

The Story of the Hands In Leonardo da Vinci's Masterpiece

During the service, notice how skillfully the artist expresses the emotions of the men by their hands. Their hands alone tell the story. Leonardo searched for hands to use as models for painting the hands of Christ, and he records in his notebook about finding them. Christ's right hand, palm downward, seems to say, "If it be possible, let this cup pass from Me." His left hand, upturned, seems to suggest, "Nevertheless, not as I will, but as Thou will." Christ's hands alone tell the story of the human and divine natures that meet in Him.

John has his hands folded upon the table in submissive innocence. Judas clutches the money bag with his right hand. In the original painting, Judas overturns the saltshaker with his elbow. Peter impulsively reaches for John with his left hand and holds in the other hand his knife with its handle against Judas' back.

James, the Greater, flings his hands out in a double gesture of surprise. Thomas thrusts an inquiring finger into the face of Jesus, demanding, "Lord, where are You going?" Philips' hands, pointing to himself, seem to emphasize his burning questions: "Lord, show us the Father, and we shall be satisfied."

Andrew's hands, said to be among the most handsome in all art, are outstretched before him in an expression of disdain. James, the Lesser, is stretching out his hand behind Andrew to Peter. Nathaniel is clutching the table to steady himself with his hands. Matthew points with both hands to the Savior in an effort to emphasize what he is saying. Thaddeus is pointing his thumb toward Jesus. Simon, the Zealot, who has reason to be puzzled by this strange turn of events, lifts his hands in a helpless gesture of resignation. 
Cooperative Christian Ministry has asked churches in Cabarrus County to respond to an urgent need for added resources.
