This Sunday, May 25 we will continue to think on hope. Hope is a Christian word also used in our everyday lexicon. While they are the same word, the English and Biblical word have different meanings. The English word "hope" is desire for a positive outcome or an eager expectation. "I'm going to the Cannon Baller's game tonight. I hope it does not rain." This hope is rooted in our human will and expressed in our thinking and attitudes. Hope is a self-help principle. Such hope is a good thing.

The word "hope" in the Bible has a different meaning. Christian hope is a confidence in the present based on a certainty of the future. Christian hope is rooted in God's sovereign character and the grace of God in Christ. Our confidence is who and whose we are "in Christ" and our certainty of our future is "in Christ". "If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord." (Romans 14:8)

Our teaching this Sunday is based on I Peter 1:3-9. "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In His great mercy He has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you". (I Peter 1:3-4)
