


# THE WEEKLY FIRST



We continue our teaching series from the book of Proverbs, which offers God-centered wisdom for living well. Despite being written 3000 years ago, its teachings are still relevant today. Proverbs highlights the timeless nature of humanity and life's complexities. True wisdom begins with reverence for God (Prov. 1:7) and is demonstrated through competence in all areas of life. Our topic Sunday is "Wisdom for a crushed spirit". Below is a list of Proverbs we are thinking on.

"Anxiety weighs down the heart, but a kind word cheers it up." (12:25)

"Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a longing fulfilled is a tree of life." (13:12)

"Each heart knows its own bitterness, and no one else can share its joy." (14:10)

"Even in laughter the heart may ache, and rejoicing may end in grief." (14:13)

"A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones." (14:30)

"The soothing tongue is a tree of life, but a perverse tongue crushes the spirit." (15:4)

"A happy heart makes the face cheerful, but heartache crushes the spirit. The discerning heart seeks knowledge, but the mouth of a fool feeds on folly." (15:13-14)

"All a person's ways seem pure to them, but motives are weighed by the Lord."(16:2)

"The human spirit can endure in sickness, but a crushed spirit who can bear?"(18:14)

"The wicked flee though no one pursues, but the righteous are as bold as a lion." (28:1)
