A Nursery is available for newborns through age 4. It is located in the Educational Building. If you need assistance or directions, an usher would be happy to help you!




This Sunday marks our monthly 10 Cents-A-Meal

Reformation Sunday

Today, many Protestant churches celebrate Reformation Day. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 Thesis/Protests on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany. These protests were surreptitiously printed into the German language and became a catalyst for a movement which eventually became widely known as the Protestant Reformation.

Luther, Calvin and other Reformers, guided by biblical convictions, sought to reorient Christianity on the foundations of the Apostles and Prophets with Jesus Christ as the Chief Cornerstone (Eph 2:29). The five "Solas" (Latin phrases which gave unity and summarized the core theological convictions of the Protestant Reformation are as follows:

- Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone): The Bible alone is our highest authority.
- Sola Fide (Faith Alone): We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ.
- Sola Gratia (Grace Alone): We are saved by the grace of God alone.
- Solis Christus (Christ Alone): Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior, and King.
- Soli Deo Gloria (To the Glory of God Alone): We live for the Glory of God alone.

In these days, may God grant us deeper faith and courage to hold fast to the Word of God, rest in the Gospel of Christ, and live for the glory of our great and glorious God.
