

Words of Encouragement....

> John 7:17 -

If anyone is willing to do His will, he will know of the teaching, whether it is of God or whether I speak from Myself. [NASB]

Anyone who wants to do the will of God will know whether my teaching is from God or is merely my own. [NLT]

The key to what Jesus said in John 7:17 is this: *the sequence*.

- 1. You have to have a desire or willingness to do God's will (to act, to obey, to carry-out);
- 2. *THEN* comes the knowledge we can experientially understand.

We, too often, want to have knowledge and understanding before we are willing to say "yes" (to obey). But in God's economy of faith, what He wants is a desire and willingness to obey on our part <u>first</u>. Then comes the understanding and knowledge.

This is how we are to walk by faith. A heart ready, set on "obey;" and trusting that God will give us knowledge and understanding <u>as</u> we obey (do His will).

This process and expectation violates our carnal (fleshly) tendencies. It makes us uncomfortable. But, our natural tendency to <u>not start</u> with obedience also prevents us from fully knowing and understanding. It keeps us on the outside, looking in – wanting to know, but unable to understand.

Furthermore, obedience leads to blessing. Disobedience leads to trouble. Remember Jesus' parable of the two builders who each built a house? One built on cheap, easy-to-access sand. The other built on costly, difficult-to-reach rock. The second construction project, the one on rock, demanded more time and expense. But when spring rains turned the creek into a gulley washer, guess which builder enjoyed a blessing and which experienced trouble?



According to Jesus, in Matthew 7:24, the wise builder is whoever <u>hears</u> what the Lord is saying and <u>does them</u>. Both builders heard the

teachings. The difference between the two wasn't knowledge and ignorance, but obedience and disobedience. Certainty and security come as we put God's precepts into practice. We're only as strong as our obedience.

Blessings to you on this journey of obedience.



I don't necessarily support all of what John Piper says, however, I believe he is spot on with this statement. It begs the question of what or who our satisfaction is placed. This is a fundamental understanding that we all—as Christ-followers—must answer. Yet, it is so hard to answer.

I bet we can all say, "Yes, I am satisfied in my LORD!" However, if that is true, the above statement about Him being "glorified in us" must also be true. Sadly, Jesus is not always glorified in all we do. Of course, we are sinners...saved by grace, but we cannot hide behind that any more than the early Christians Paul spoke to concerning grace.

So, what is the point, Seth? My point is that I sometimes find myself wondering where my satisfaction is placed. Is it placed solely in the LORD—as it should be? Embarrassingly enough, it is not. I recognize that. I bet you can recognize that, too. With the biggest celebration approaching—Resurrection Sunday—I find myself wondering how "satisfied" am I in the LORD. It is a scary question to ask, but if we ask it, we can begin to tear down any barriers that are keeping us from placing our full trust in Him.

Resurrection Sunday is about the redemption of humanity finally realized through the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Jesus. Beat. Death and Sin. And, through Him, we can too! If we would but humble ourselves enough to let God do His "thing" in our lives, we can glorify God through our witness of satisfaction in Him! What a beautiful testimony!

So, as we prepare our hearts for Resurrection Sunday, focus on Christ, His Words, His Commands, His Attributes, His Love, His willingness to experience death for you and me, and most of all, His Grace. Are you and I satisfied with His grace? When we are, He will be most glorified in us!
