# Words of Encouragement....

*Exodus*  $4:18 \ge$  *Moses went back to Jethro his father-in-law and said to him, "Please let me go back to my brothers in Egypt to see whether they are still alive." And Jethro said to Moses, "Go in peace." [ESV]* 

In a recent devotional I read by Charles Swindoll, he offered some encouraging insight from this passage. Verse 18 offers a glimpse into Moses' humanity and God's patience.

What precedes this verse in chapters 3 and 4 is the account of God calling Moses to go to Pharoah and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt. As the story goes, Moses wasn't so keen or confident about returning to Egypt. Remember, he'd run from there 40 years earlier after taking things into his own hands and killing an Egyptian.

Even though Moses clearly recognized that it was God who was speaking to him (he took his sandals off), he was full of excuses as to why he wasn't the one to go back to Egypt and deliver his fellow Hebrews. He didn't think the Israelites would accept his leadership or believe what he was being asked by God to say. He also didn't think he was cut-out for the life of a public speaker.

With each excuse, God gave Moses the words he was to say to the people; and gave Moses a public speaking assistant (his brother Aaron). God even took Moses' shepherd's staff and divinely supercharged it so Moses could perform signs with it. (4:17)

But when Moses goes back to his home-camp to talk with Jethro his father-in-law about a leave of absence, he left just a few things out of the account he'd had with God. What Moses said to his father-in-law was simply, "I want to go see if any of my buddies down in Egypt are still alive." In essence, Moses just asked for some time-off from his shepherding responsibilities. And Jethro says, "Fine. Go ahead... and have a good time."

Somehow, Moses couldn't bring himself to tell Jethro what really happened to him in the wilderness. Instead of saying, "there was this bush on fire out in the desert that wouldn't burn-up... and there was this voice in the bush, and it was God. God wants me to go back to Egypt and lead the whole nation of Israel in an Exodus out of slavery and deliver them to Canaan."

He just couldn't bring himself to say that! Instead, he asked Jethro for some time away so he could go check on old friends and family.

But God, in His grace, doesn't get upset with Moses' justification and lack of details. He doesn't slap Moses' hand. He doesn't say, "Knock it off, Moses! Tell Jethro the whole story." God just lets Moses explain his departure with a kind of broad-brush, nebulous explanation.

That kind of encourages my heart. God is so patient with us and gracious to us. Moses was packing his bags for Egypt, and God let it go at that. I suspect Moses was overwhelmed by what God had said to him. While Moses might have been processing what it all meant, he still was obeying what God asked of him... and going to Egypt.

What God asks of us is a willing heart. He doesn't expect perfection. He doesn't expect you to have all the answers, all the ability, or all the courage. He doesn't even require you to spell out each detail of His call. He just asks you to be available and take that first step of faith in the direction He's pointing.

So, whatever it is that God is asking of you, have a willing heart... and take the first step.

Many blessings to you on your journey of obedience to the Lord.
