Start thinking. Ask a question to get your group thinking.

Start sharing. Choose a question to create openness.

- Revelation 22:13 gives examples of God being "both/and".
 When you consider science and the Bible as being "both/and" instead of "either/or," what thoughts and feelings come up?
- What questions do you have for God that you would like to study and investigate some more?
- Share about an experience that required you to put your trust in God, even if you still had questions. How was your faith impacted during that time?
- What truth about Jesus can you remember when you have doubts and questions? How might that truth help you sustain a growing, maturing faith?

Start doing. Commit to a step and live it out this week.

- Spend time thinking about the truths of Jesus and your personal experiences with Jesus. Write these truths out and put them in a place where you'll see them regularly.
- Purchase The Case for Faith by Lee Strobel and start reading.
- Start/Continue the New Testament in Year Bible Reading Plan.

Start praying. Be bold. Pray for one another with God's power.
