**Series:** Loving the City: Healing a Nation **Week 1:** The Heart of Transformation

**Scripture:** Nehemiah 1:1–4

### **Icebreaker (Choose 1)**

- What's your favorite thing to show off to visitors about San Diego? What tops your list?
- If you were elected 'Mayor of Fun' for our city, what's the first fun thing you'd add or change?

### Digging into the Bible

- 1. Read Nehemiah 1:1–4 together. What stands out to you about Nehemiah's response to the report about Jerusalem?
- 2. Why do you think Nehemiah asked about the city in the first place, even though he was living comfortably in exile?

#### Point 1: We Need to Listen

- 4. Nehemiah chose to listen to the painful realities of his city rather than ignore them.
  - What are some ways we can "listen" to our city today?
  - o What keeps us from really paying attention to the brokenness around us?
- 5. The sermon mentioned that San Diego has both beauty and brokenness. Where do you see or encounter either of these as you go about your day?

#### **Point 2: We Need to Lament**

- 6. Nehemiah wept, fasted, and prayed in response to the city's condition.
  - Why is lament a powerful response to brokenness?
  - Which of the three practices (crying, fasting, praying) is most natural for you?
    Which is hardest?
- 7. How does lament connect us more deeply with the suffering of Jesus and the power of his resurrection (Phil. 3:10-11)?

## **Application & Challenge**

- 8. The challenge this week is to **listen** (pay attention to the realities of our city) and **lament** (cry, fast, and pray).
  - o What is one practical way you can intentionally "listen" to San Diego this week?
  - o How can you incorporate lament into your prayer life?
- 9. If God were to break your heart for one specific area of our city (e.g., loneliness, homelessness, violence, division), what do you think it might be? How might you respond?

## **Closing Prayer**

Take a few minutes to share any burdens you're carrying for the city. Close in prayer, asking God to:

- Help us listen well.
- Break our hearts for what breaks God's heart.
- Empower us to join in God's work of transformation in San Diego.
