*In Part 2 of our Christmas Series, we are going to look at the fullness of grace and truth in Jesus Christ, a cup brimming to the top, so overflowing that we receive grace upon grace. Jesus Christ, we learn, is full of grace and of truth, and through him God is made known.

*We must remember although Jesus brought Christmas Light, we are still going to deal with Dark Times. But Praise God for Jesus and how he overflows our cup of blessings upon blessings with his Grace and Truth.

- I. The Word was made flesh (v. 14)
 - *14a: So the Word became Human and made his home among us.
 - *14b: He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son.
 - *Matthew 17:1-2: Six days later Jesus took Peter and the two brothers, James and John, and led them up a high mountain to be alone. As the men watched, Jesus' appearance was transformed so that his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as light.

*Luke 9:32: Peter and the others had fallen asleep. When they woke up, they saw Jesus' glory and the two men standing with him.
